

Silver Lake Summer Hoops 2020 Covid-19 Preventative Plan

(In accordance with the CDC recommendations for Youth Sports and Summer Programs as of 6/6/2020- this can be adjusted as more information is released by the State and CDC regarding summer camps).

We are revising our current program due to the Covid-19 exposure risk. Changes are as follows (these are subject to change at any time to be in compliance with the CDC requirements)

- Current location is Halifax Elementary School and Silver Lake Regional High School.
- Our program will now focus more on individual/small group skill building. There will not be any scrimmaging or competitive games played as long as the CDC recommends not to.
- Campers will be grouped together and remain with the same group during the duration of the camp.
- Groups will be between 6-8 campers to one Coach.
- No more than 8 campers at each basketball hoop at a time.
- Campers will be required to provide proof of medical clearance from a licensed physician in the State of MA to attend Camp (up to date physical and immunization sheet)
- Campers who require medication to be administered while at camp will need to provide a letter of medical necessity from a licensed physician in MA granting permission and instruction for SLSH Staff (SLSH Medical Professional on Duty) to administer medication. This letter will need to accompany any prescriptions that one might need while at camp. I.E. Inhalers, Epipens, Insulin, etc)
- Campers will be required to bring with them to camp each day and also everything must be labeled with the camper's name : personal sunscreen, Water bottle (disposable preferred but not required), Lunch (disposable preferred but not required), Hand, Face Mask to be kept in a zip lock bag, Rubber Gloves to be kept in a zip lock bag, and individual package of Tissues.
- SLSH Camp will provide at a cost: Pizza, Gatorade, and Water.
- Bug Juice will continue to be free.
- SLSH Camp will provide disposable cups for Bug Juice.
- SLSH will have all Water and Bug Juice Jugs monitored and any water bottles that need to be refilled will be done by Camp Staff.
- SLSH will have large trash bins onsite that will not need to be touched for things to be thrown away in.
- SLSH will have onsite soap, water, hand sanitizer, disinfecting products (i.e. Lysol Spray), paper towels, tissues, face masks for SLSH staff, all required medical supplies, medical gloves, and any other products that is needed.
- SLSH will provide each Camper with their own basketball that will be labeled with the Campers Name and Grade. This will be kept at camp for the duration of camp and will be disinfected by SLSH Staff at the conclusion of Camp each day.
- SLSH will also provide each Camper with a Camp T-Shirt
- SLSH will practice a daily health check of campers, cleaning and disinfecting schedule which is as follows:
 - Before Camp starts each day, the staff members will be checked over by SLSH Medical Staff (temperature check using a "no touch" thermometer and symptom check) and asked to wash hands. This will be logged.

- Campers will also be checked and asked to sanitize their hands before starting camp.
- Before and After lunch Campers and Staff will be required to wash/sanitize their hands again before returning to camp.
- At the conclusion of camp each day, Staff and Campers will handwash/sanitize again.
- Once all Campers have left the building, all equipment will be sanitized by SLSH Staff. *If possible, janitor to sanitize the areas of use. SLSH to keep a log of temp checks and washing schedule.
- Any Staff and or Camper who has a temperature and or demonstrated signs of illness will immediately be asked to wear a mask and taken to a private area away from other people, parents will be asked to pick up their child/Staff member will be asked to leave. Person will not be allowed to join camp until a letter of good health is obtained by a licensed MA physician. Sick Camper/Staff contact info will be kept on file.
- SLSH will have a medical consultant at camp every day (EMT, Paramedic, or Nurse)
- Campers will not be required to wear face masks during camp the entire time (unless parent requests this) Instead, they will wear masks during Down time, Water Balloon Toss, during handwashing times, drink refill times, and any other time basketball instruction is not being taught.
